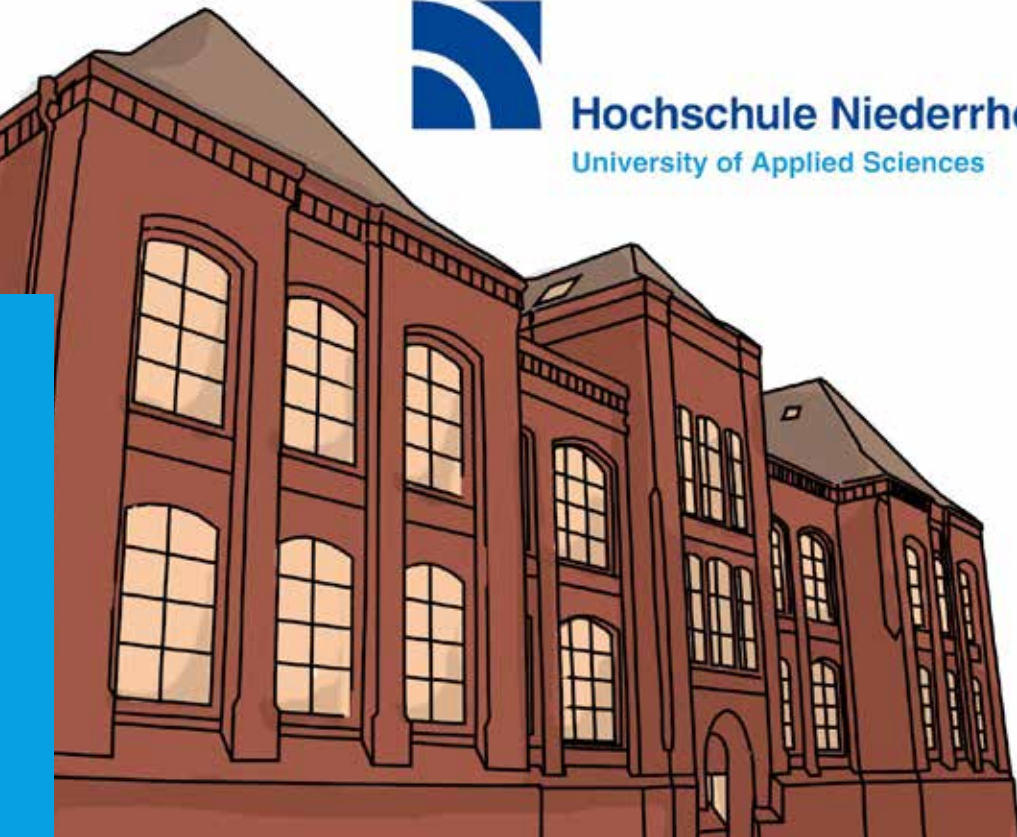

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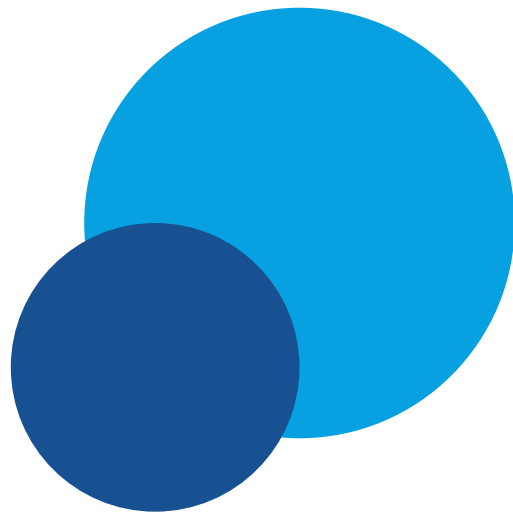

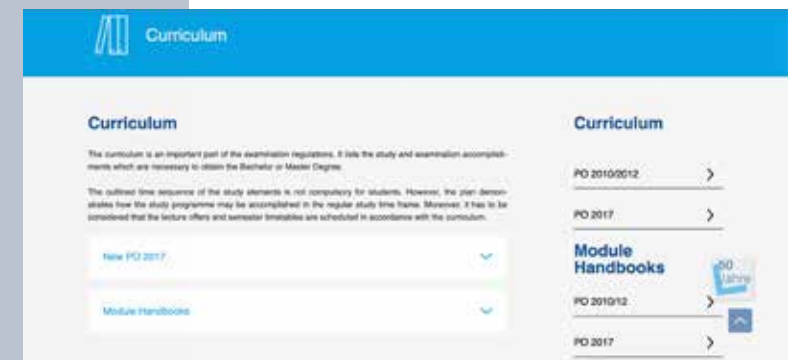


# STUDIES.

All courses of study were reaccredited in spring 2017. The current study regulations and course plans can be found on the Internet.

## IMPORTANT NOTES

- » The basic studies are the same for all major subjects, except for a few subjects. A specialization takes place in the 3rd semester.
- » You can apply for a change to a different focus at the Examination Office. Examinations that have already been passed can be credited, missing subjects must be made up.
- » To change to the degree program Design-Engineer, you must pass the aptitude assessment test. It always takes place in the summer semester.
- » Switching between the fields of study DI-Mode and DI-Textil is not possible without re-examination, as the aptitude assessment test is specific to the field of study.
- » BAföG is paid normally when you change your degree programme or focus, but you must inform the BAföG Office immediately (see 4. 8).

## FB07 – INTERNAL

First of all, the student council is the totality of all students at the university. It is subdivided into different departments, in our case that is the Department of Textile and Apparel Technology, also called Faculty 07 (FB 07). The respective faculty is represented by the Student Council, which is composed of committed students of the faculty and is elected once a year by the Student Council. The FSR is responsible for the special interests of the students

and for representing them vis-à-vis the university. We are also your contact person for questions and criticism and always have an open ear for your problems in university matters.

The faculty council is the highest internal body within the faculty. It decides on important issues, such as courses, personnel and the like.

Members of the FBR are:

- » The dean, in an advisory capacity. He is the head of the department and is elected by the professors for a term of four years each
- » The Vice-Dean, in an advisory capacity
- » 6 elected professors
- » 2 Employees
- » 3 students

The FBR usually meets monthly during the lecture period. The meetings are open to the public. You learn a lot about life, backgrounds and politics at the university and the faculty in general.



# SENATE

The Senate plays a central role as an intermediary between the individual departments and between the university and the ministry.

It consists of 24 members with voting rights:

- » 12 professors
- » 8 Employees
- » 4 students

The chairperson is elected from among the members of the Senate. Deans of all faculties, Vice-Deans, Chancellors, Equal Opportunities Officers and AStA chairpersons assist in an advisory capacity.

The Senate is responsible, inter alia, for the following matters:

- » Confirmation of the election of Bureau members
- » Opinion on the Bureau's annual report
- » Dissemination and amendment of the university's regulations

StuPa or Student Parliament is the highest body of self-government. Self-government means that we, the students, take the bowl in our own hands. This is where loans are granted, policies are drawn up and elections are organised. The parliament may consist of up to 31 members of the "Constituted Student Union" (i. e. all registered students of HS Niederrhein). Each department can fill a position by means of

a direct application; However, the majority of them originate from various lists, also called student parties, which are made up of like-minded people throughout the university. Everyone can found a party himself and thus become active. Guests are always welcome to attend meetings.

If you have special talents and can e. g. memorize the chemical formula of PET or explain the complete induction to your fellow students, then become Tutor: Commitment plus Money!

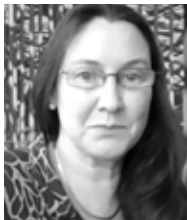

# LECTURES & INTERNSHIPS.

In the first semester, you will receive a ready-made "schedule." Where and when your events take place, you can find from this plan. All lectures are mandatory, and attendance is not controlled.

This is different, for example with internships. There you will take part in small groups, into which you have been divided during the first days of registration. Here your presence and participation will be checked by the professors. We advise you to always arrive punctually and well prepared for the internship dates. If you don't have time for an appointment or are sick, it is possible to exchange the appointment and join another group. It is important to always have your materials (documents, tickets, etc.) with you.

If you miss the security briefing, you will no longer be able to participate. This also applies if you are late for the security briefing.

# ELECTIVES.

During the course of studies, credits must be collected in the so-called elective subjects. A large number of electives are offered. In addition, subjects from other specialisations can be taken and counted as elective subjects. Compulsory electives are offered in the winter and summer semesters. We recommend that you take the elective subjects only from the 3rd semester. So you don't have to worry about it in the first semester.

# TUTORIALS.

Many students start to panic when they think about the so-called problem subjects, such as maths, physics and chemistry.

Fortunately, there are some “checkers” among the students every semester, who agree in tutorials to chew through the course material with the “non-checkers” once again gaaanz langsaaam. Here you can also ask the embarrassing questions for which the professor would have thrown you out. So just be brave, because this is the chance to get out of the exam with a great score (even without ever failing).

For those who have failed examinations, so-called “repetitors” are offered. Tutorials and tutorials are organized in German and English by Ms. Korsten ([ursula.korsten@hs-niederrhein.de](mailto:ursula.korsten@hs-niederrhein.de)). They want to make it easier for students to arrive at the university and to support them in their learning process (including workshops and personal consultations).

What the textbooks were in school are now the scripts. They are either written by the professors and made available so that they can be used in the lecture, or they are scripts from previous semesters that have not been approved by the professor, but may be very helpful. No matter what kind, scripts usually don't spare you to swing your pen and write it down yourself. That is, if there is room, scribble into the script or create clean and tidy folders with your own notes.

You will receive the helpful and less helpful papers from the professors within the first few weeks. The scripts are free of charge.

# EXAMINATIONS.

The exam phase takes place in FB 07 at the end of each semester and lasts a total of three weeks. If the result is a score of 4. 0 or better, congratulations, you passed. Anything worse unfortunately fails and has to be repeated. A total of three experiments are possible. Basically, only notes with X,3; X. 7 and X. 0. (For example: a 1. 5 is not possible in exams; BUT only 1. 3; 1. 7). Check your own exam registration in the status of the Campus Management System (hio.hsnr.de)! If it's missing, there's no registration!

If you decide not to take part in an exam, due to laziness or illness, it is a good idea to unsubscribe in the same way. If you become weak during an exam, you must immediately report this to the supervisor and go to the doctor. A later objection will not be accepted. Late registered examinations will not be accepted! If you are not satisfied with a grade or are simply curious, you have the opportunity to watch the exam. Please contact the respective lecturer. Since the 2017 examination regulations, it is possible to apply for two "free attempts to improve grades" in the Bachelor's degree programmes (more information on the internet/examination regulations or in the examination office).

For the preparation of the exam, your own transcripts, scripts, summaries or old exam questions are essential. Simply ask in the higher semesters or directly with the professors. Otherwise: start learning early enough, make sure you have enough coffee and chocolate and relax enough, then you will get through the exam phase in good condition.

Student & ID card must be brought to the exam! Mobile phones are always to be switched off!

Certificates are certificates of achievement at the end of courses in which no exam is written. The difference is that the testates are not graded, but only "passed" or "followed."

If you don't pass it, you can repeat it indefinitely. However, this is only a small advantage, because most of the time you have to attend the entire course again. To pass, you must also have participated regularly and actively.

Experience has shown that a certificate is the culmination of an internship. They can look very different, in the form of elaborations, presentations or practical work.

# ONLINE-PORTAL.

The online portal for students is ensured by the data processing of the university administration. Here you can register exams, view grades or change personal data.

This is how it works:

You will receive a letter from the university with a numbered TAN list (60 TANs) and a password. At: [iman.hs-niederrhein.de/startpage.html](http://iman.hs-niederrhein.de/startpage.html) you can use this initial password to create a university account. With this you can then register in the online portal [hio.hsnr.de](http://hio.hsnr.de). When registering/unregistering for the exam, you will now be asked to enter a certain TAN (e. g. No. 25). Be sure to keep this list, because you will need it throughout your studies! If these TANs are used up, additional TANs can be generated.

In case of difficulties, you can contact IT support. Basically, however, the procedure is very simple.

In addition, each student automatically receives an email address with the domain "firstname.lastname@stud.hn.de." You are obliged to use this email address for communication with the faculty and to check it for news at least once a week. Here you will receive information about news and changes.

**CAUTION:** Don't use your initial password for the email address, but change it!

By the way, this account only remains until the exmatriculation and is organized by the HN Identity Manager.

# RE-REGISTRATION.

The re-registration for the next semester takes place via the payment of the semester fee.

Further information and bank details can be found on the online portal Hio-hsnr.de – under: My Studies – Student Services – Payments

The status sheet is a summary of achievements for the information of the student. It says which subject or module you passed when, with which grade you passed or failed. Usually the first notes appear here already during the exam phase. You can find the status sheet on the homepage in the online portal.

It is not used as a certificate, but it can of course be used as a provisional proof for a prospective employer in the case of applications (possibly with the certification of the examination office).

## » Problems with professors? «

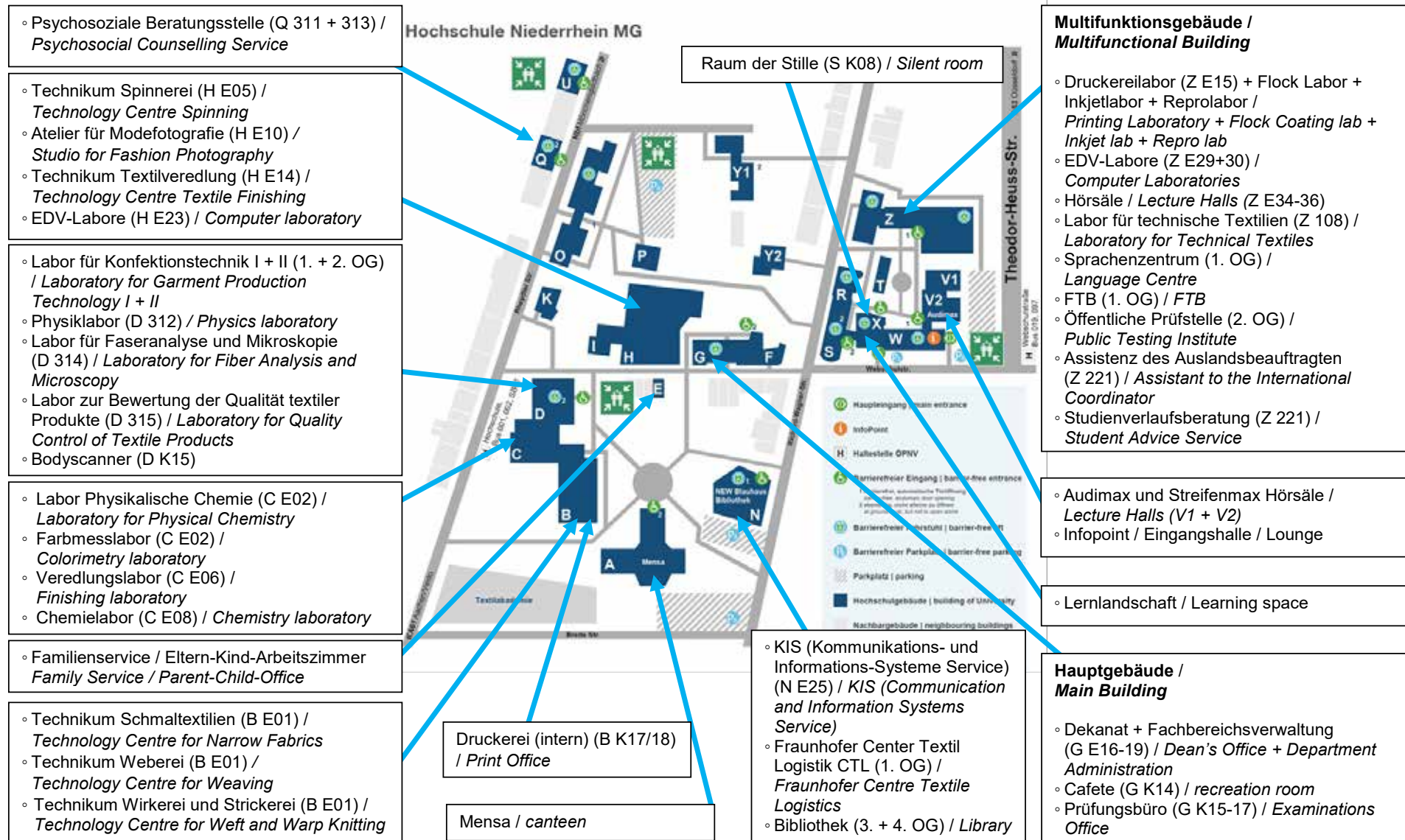

You can describe the problem to the trust tutors, the trust tutor or the FSR, who then try to mediate or are just there to listen.

Of course, you can also go directly to the professors, preferably in private and not during or after the lecture! Almost every professor has set up fixed office hours. Of course, it takes a lot of courage, but you can be sure to be taken seriously. There will be no negative impact on you if you address your concern. No matter how you approach the problem; only talking people can be helped! We believe we can rightly say that we have few problems with professors at our university, as most of them are open and student-oriented. In addition, we see the cooperative collaboration of students and professors as a particular strength of the Hochschule Niederrhein.

## CANTEEN

In our cafeteria you can eat your fill for prices between 0.80 € and 3.50 € and actually always find something to your individual taste. At lunchtime there are always two meals and a soup or stew to choose from. There is also the salad buffet and various small items. So there is always a vegetarian/vegan offer. The menus for the respective days are stored on the iHN app and on the university homepage. There you can also see the ingredients displayed. On the first visit you should buy a canteen card, which you can then recharge at the cash desk. Without a canteen card, there is a 50 cent bar surcharge on the lunch menu. Since all departments have a break at lunchtime, the cafeteria is always very crowded at lunchtime, so it is advisable to reload the card in advance so that the queue is not unnecessarily delayed.

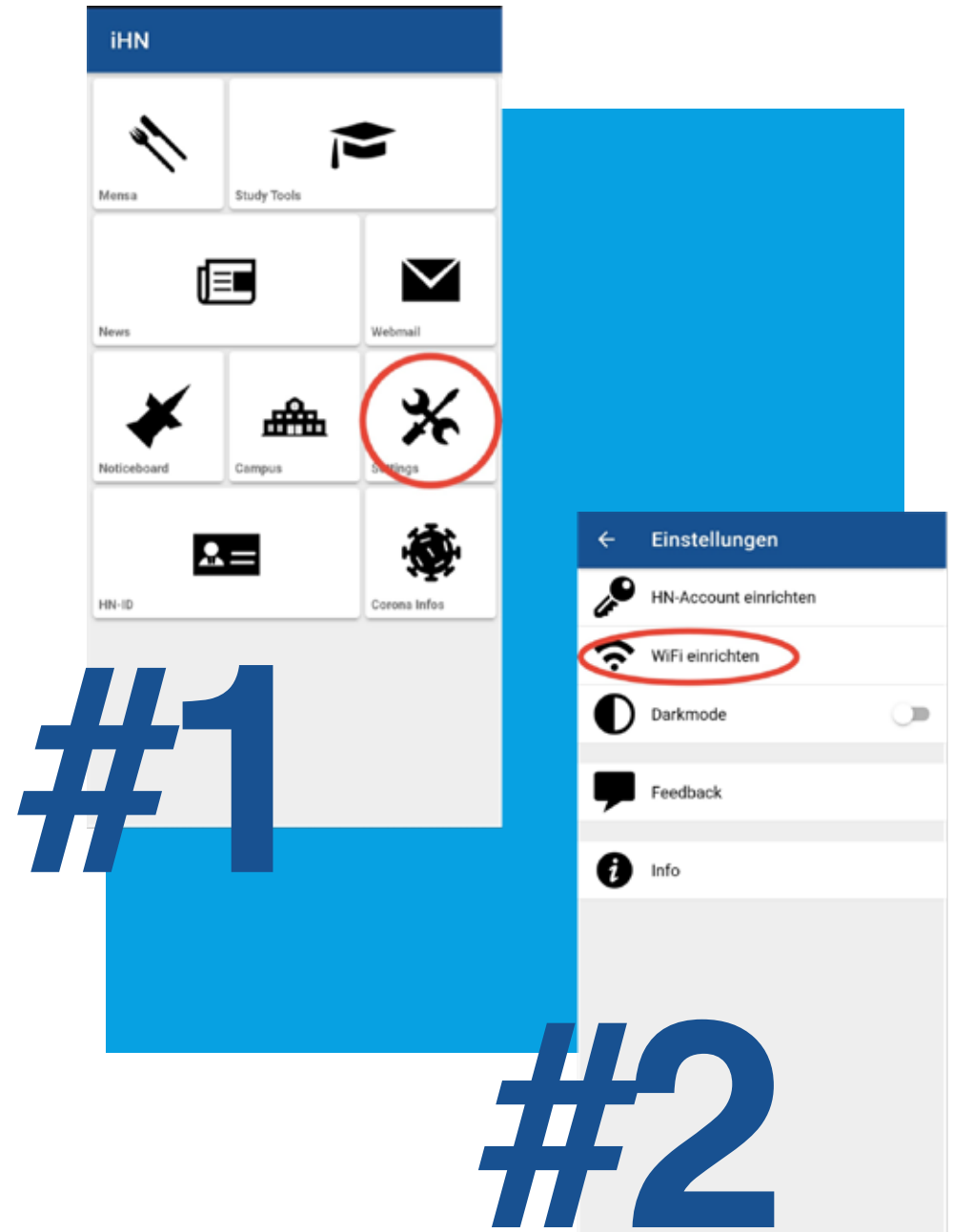
The four “ThinkTanks” in Building X offer you the possibility to connect your laptop to a presentation screen if necessary.

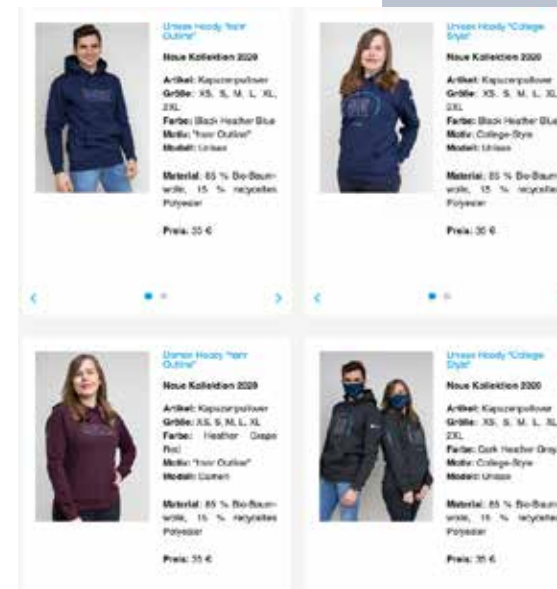
